Required qualifications

- MD, PhD, or equivalent
- Expertise in clinical or translational mood disorders, as evidenced by an established independent research program
- Track record of extramural funding, such as NIH-funding
- Track record of collaborative approach to research
- Track record in teaching and mentoring

Position duties and responsibilities

- Report to the chair of the UCSF Department of Psychiatry
- Build and direct an actively-funded research program in mood disorders
- Contribute to the design of department and UCSF-wide clinical research infrastructure in mood disorders
- Collaborate effectively and develop joint programs with faculty members within the Department of Psychiatry and in other departments such as Pediatrics, Neurology, Basic Neuroscience, and other colleagues at UCSF and UC Berkeley to promote clinical research in mood disorders
- Collaborate effectively with basic, clinical and translational research leaders to promote the evaluation and implementation of new, more effective, evidence-based treatments and clinical interventions
- Optimize faculty development, professionalism, recruitment, advancement, and retention
- Foster and support career development of junior investigators
- Participate in department and university service
