Qualifications

- MD, MD/PhD, PhD or equivalent
- Postdoctoral research training
- Record of peer-reviewed publications
- Track record of investigational work in at least one of the basic, translational or clinical sciences directly contributing to the etiology, prevention, diagnosis and/or treatment of neuropsychiatric disorders. Areas of interest include but are not restricted to: developmental neuroscience, cognitive neuroscience, developmental psychology, developmental psychopathology, genetics, epidemiology, neuroimaging, behavioral neuroscience, computational science, and bioengineering
- Established skill in research relevant to neuropsychiatric disease, broadly defined, including but not limited to molecular, cellular, systems, developmental and behavioral neuroscience, genetics, imaging or other advanced technologies
- Demonstrated cultural competence in working with underserved and culturally diverse trainee and patient populations
- Preference will be given to MD/PhDs or MDs with psychiatric training as well as to others with a demonstrated commitment to advancing the understanding of psychiatric and neurodevelopmental disorders

Responsibilities

- Develop an innovative, competitive research program
- Participate in teaching, supervision or support of educational programs for medical students, residents, psychology interns, postdoctoral fellows, or graduate students in a variety of disciplines
- May provide direct patient care
- Educate UCSF health professional trainees through teaching, supervision and assessment of trainees, modeling clinical and/or educational scholarship for trainees
- Participate in departmental, university, and/or public service
